

# Embedded Questions!

When you make embedded Qs, ask yourself what kind of question it is. Is it *Yes/No*, or a *WH* question. Is it used with *BE* verb or *Do/Does/Did*? *If/Whether* is used in *Yes/No* Qs, while in *Do/Does/Did* sentences, you drop the *Do/Does/Did* and maybe change the verb. The word order can also change with *BE* verbs and helping Verbs moving back in the sentence.

## Wh Qs

Who is he?  
Where are they?  
What does she do?

## Wh Embedded Qs

Do you know who he is?  
Do you know where they are?  
Do you know what she does?

## Yes/No Qs

Is the dog here?  
Was she drunk?  
Does the teacher  
speak French?  
Did she eat my  
dog?

## Y/N Embedded Qs (if/whether)

Do you know where the dog is?  
Do you know whether she was drunk?  
Do you know if the teacher  
speaks French?  
Do you know whether she ate  
My dog?
